### Allscripts Downtime – Sunday January 27, 2019

- New concentrations for the following drips will be added to the order sets and browse items in Allscripts, as well as in the Allscripts flowsheets and the pump library.
  - DOBUTamine drip (DOBUTREX) 500 mg/250 mL (2mg/mL)
  - DOPamine drip (INTROPIN) 800 mg/250 mL (1.6 mg/mL)
  - PENTobarbital drip (NEMBUTAL) 1000 mg/250 mL (4mg/mL)

### Adult DOPAmine and doBUTamine standard concentrations change in Allscripts

The standard concentrations for adults will be changing in Allscripts (order sets and order items) for both dopamine and dobutamine on **Tuesday, February 5th.** These changes will align Allscripts to the BSWH ADULT standard concentrations for these medications. The changes will be reflected in the IV Pump Library update also occurring on February 5th. The new standard concentrations are:

- DOPAmine 800 mg / 250 ml
- doBUTamine 500 mg / 250 ml

Pharmacy operational changes are needed to address stock outside of pharmacy (crash carts, automated dispensing cabinets, etc.)




#### ASHP Midyear Meeting



Duration of antibiotic therapy for Staphylococcus aureus bacteremia in oncology patients




